COVID-19 Outbreaks:

- <u>Island Health declares COVID-19 outbreak on Transitional Care Unit at Nanaimo Regional General Hospital</u>
 - Island Health has declared a COVID-19 outbreak on the Transitional Care Unit at Nanaimo Regional General Hospital (NRGH) where four patients have tested positive for COVID-19.
- Outbreak declared at Chartwell Malaspina Care Centre Hummingbird Unit
 Island Health's outbreak response has identified three cases of COVID-19 at
 Chartwell Malaspina Care Centre's Hummingbird Unit.

- On Tuesday Oct. 26 Provincial Health Officer Dr.
 Bonnie Henry announced that everyone 18 years
 and older will be offered a <u>booster dose</u> of
 COVID-19 vaccine, starting with people most at
 risk
- Seniors 70+ and Indigenous people 18+ are among the first to be scheduled, also health care workers and medical staff who received their first two doses



on a shortened schedule (less than 42 days between doses 1 and 2) are being prioritized.

- You must <u>be registered in B.C.'s Get Vaccinated registration system</u> in order to receive a booster dose, and easy instructions are available on our <u>website</u>.
 - Some health care workers who were immunized before May, 2021 may not be registered. If you have not registered please do so as soon as possible.
 - After registering you will be notified by email, text, or phone call when it's your turn to book an appointment.
 - A booster dose is not required to be considered fully vaccinated under the BC Vaccine Card program or the vaccine mandate for health care workers.
 - All booster doses will be either the Moderna or Pfizer (mRNA) vaccines, which are interchangeable.

All booster doses will be mRNA vaccines approved in Canada. People will receive either the Moderna or Pfizer (mRNA) vaccine for their booster dose as these vaccines are interchangeable. If you received AstraZeneca for your first or second dose, you will receive Moderna or Pfizer for your booster.

• Exceptions to Vaccination Requirements for Visitors in Long-Term Care and Seniors Assisted Living Care Settings

Overview of Visitors in Long-Term Care and Seniors' Assisted Living guidance, exceptions regarding vaccination requirements (for partially or unimmunized individuals) may be considered on a case by case basis if the visitor has an approved medical exemption, is a child under the age of vaccine eligibility and/or the reason for the visit with a resident is for compassionate reasons such as end of life.

A fit test is a procedure to ensure that a staff member is wearing the right make, model, and size of respirator. Going through the fit test processes also helps as a

refresher session for staff who only occasionally need to wear tight fitting respiratory protection as a part of their job.

This document focuses on therapy uses for Pregnant patients who have COVID-19 that are either hospitalized ICU based, Hospitalized ward based or Ambulatory outpatient.

<u>Updated: Order of the Provincial Health Officer –</u> <u>Face Coverings COVID-19</u>

Updated information in regards to the indoor mask mandate being extended. This document touches on what constitutes indoor public spaces, who is mandated to wear face masks within these spaces and who has possible exemption. Masks are required in all public indoor spaces for all people born in 2016 or earlier (5+).
