

Booster Doses for Medical Staff

Reminder: In order to receive an invitation for your booster dose when you become eligible, medical staff must be registered on the <u>Get Vaccinated</u> online system AND need to self-identify as a *health care worker* on the Get Vaccinated system in <u>one of five categories</u>.

If you self-identified as a health-care worker, you are in the priority queue for a booster invitation. Those who received their second dose on or before March 15, 2021 should expect to receive a booster by the end of the year. If you won't hit the six month mark (after dose two) by the end of the year, you will not be invited until your full six month timeline is reached. A booster dose given 6-8 months after dose two will help you maintain and lengthen your protection against COVID-19.
