• COVID-19 Hospitalizations BC

Provincial Health Officer Dr. Bonnie Henry provided an update on COVID-19 hospitalizations in BC during the February 1st briefing.

• Updated visitation guidance for long-term care

Dr. Henry announced during her February 1st briefing updated visitation guidance for long-term care, which she hopes strikes the balance between minimizing the risk of transmission with the all important social contact needed by those in care.

• COVID-19: Viral Testing Guidelines for British Columbia

The BC COVID-19 Viral Testing guidance document has been updated to align with the new eligibility criteria for treatment of people with mild to moderate COVID-19. Included in the document is information regarding general guidance for people with new or worsening symptoms compatible with COVID-19, additional guidance for children, rapid antigen tests and more.



- <u>Updated: Order of the Provincial Health Officer: Gatherings & Events</u>
 The Government of British Columbia Order of the Provincial Health Officer removed the prohibition on individual or group fitness, exercise and dance exercise as of Jan. 20, 2022. Sports tournaments for children and youth are allowed as of Feb. 1, 2022. The order will change the proof of vaccination requirement for 12-year-olds to only require one dose of vaccine for entry to an event or setting where proof of vaccination is required.
- Physician Clinical Practice To ols to Navigate COVID-19 Therapies
 The BC COVID-19 Therapeutics Committee (BC CTC) has created a comprehensive set of new clinical practice tools to help physicians navigate the multiple therapies for COVID-19. These tools work together as a package.

BCCDC vaccine document updated to include a note in footnote 2 about dosage if a Moderna vaccine is provided. This document is intended to provide health care providers with approaches for individuals who have received COVID-19 vaccination outside of Canada.
