• Whole community team approach brings COV ID-19 vaccines to rural and remote communities

Whole community clinics are aimed at providing COVID-19 vaccines to all eligible people age five and older. Depending on the population size and demand in rural and remote communities, future COVID-19 vaccinations may be provided at pharmacies, regular public health clinics or at specific COVID-19 clinics.

• <u>Updated: Masks in long-term care</u>

This BCCDC guidance on the Long Term Care and Assisted Living page is updated to indicate that all visitors to long-term care facilities must wear a medical mask. Masks are required both indoors and outdoors.

• <u>Updated: Order of the Provincial Health Officer: Residential Care COVID-19</u> Vaccination Status

The Order of the Provincial Health Officer - Residential Care Vaccination Status, has been updated to include information in regards to the most recent vaccination requirements for employers, staff and residents in these facilities.

<u>Updated: Clinical Immunization Guidelines for Special Patient Populations</u>
 These BCCDC guidelines include information on the recommendations and considerations, vaccine efficacy and safety, and the contraindications or exceptions for people with the following medical considerations.

- Rapid tests for people 60+ at pharmacies
 - As of March 7, 2022, rapid antigen test kits are available through community pharmacies to people aged 60 and older.

This updated BCCDC guidance document addresses key therapeutic areas of concern for clinicians with recommendations sorted by severity of patient illness.

• Order of the Provincial Health Officer: Health Professionals COVID-19
Vaccination Status Information and Preventive Measures

On March 7, 2022 the Provincial Health Officer issued a new order. Under this new order, Colleges must verify the vaccine status of every registrant by March 31, 2022. This information can be reported to the Provincial Health Officer at an individual and aggregate level. The Order does not apply to any unregulated staff who may work in your office. This new order applies to all colleges and health professionals regulated under the Health Professions Act.

The BCCDC Communicable Disease Manual was updated on the Novavax vaccine product page to indicate that the vaccine can be pre-loaded into a syringe for up to 6 hours from first vial puncture.
