

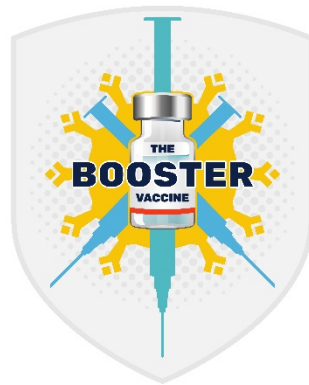

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## COVID-19 Updates:



- [Update on COVID-19 in B.C Presented by Provincial Health Officer Dr. Bonnie Henry and Health Minister Adrian Dix](#)
  - B.C. has started rolling out fourth doses of the COVID-19 vaccine for seniors over 70, Indigenous people aged 55 and older, and those who are considered clinically extremely vulnerable.
  - B.C. Vaccine Card program ending effective Friday April 8th at 12:01 a.m. PT. Individual businesses and organizations can choose to continue requiring the BC Vaccine Card on their premises.
  - As of Monday, April 11, 2022, citizens 18+ can pick up rapid antigen tests at local community pharmacies without needing to show their B.C. personal health number.

This updated BCCDC guidance document addresses key therapeutic areas of concern for clinicians with recommendations sorted by severity of patient illness.

## COVID-19 Immunization Updates:

- [Update to Communicable Disease Control Manual, Chapter 2: Immunization, Part 4 – Biological Products](#)

This updated BCCDC guidance document has been updated to indicate that residents of long term care (LTC), alternate level of care clients awaiting placement in LTC, individuals 70 years of age and older, and indigenous persons 55 years of age and older are eligible for a second booster dose at least 6 months after the first booster dose.
