It is recommended that all health care professionals (HCPs) have their immunization competencies reviewed using the BCCDC COVID-19 Immunization Skills Checklist by the employer, with the exception of Physicians, Nurse Practitioners, and HCPs who have previously completed the BCCDC Immunization Competency Course and BCCDC Immunization Skills Checklist.

All professionals handling dry ice as part of their immunization role must take the BCCDC <u>Dry Ice Handling Safety Training Course</u>.

¹ Regulated health professionals who have the authorization to perform the roles/activities independently AND can immunize without a PHO Order.

² Although additional education is not required for Nurses administering immunizations with a Physician/Nurse Practitioner order, completion of the educational resources listed below are strongly encouraged.

³ Those who have previously completed the BCCDC Immunization Competency Course are recommended to complete the BCCDC COVID-19 Immunization Webinars, and are not required to complete the BCCDC COVID-19 Immunization Competency Course for Nurses.

⁴ Pharmacists and Naturopathic Physicians who are not vaccine certified by the College of Pharmacists of BC / College of Naturopathic Physicians of BC are required to take the BCCDC Immunization Competency Course and be certified before providing immunizations.
