

# MASK POLICY



Workplace masking policy for health-care providers, patients and visitors

This document outlines Island Health and provincial expectations for the use of face masks in the workplace at Island Health. Masking, combined with the safety precautions of physical distancing, excellent hand hygiene, and staying home when unwell, will help to keep health-care workers and our patients, clients, residents and families safe from COVID-19. ## NOTES:

- Failure to comply with the policy may result in corrective action, up to and including termination (excepting legitimate reasons why an employee is unable to follow this direction).
- N95 respirators are to be reserved for AGMPs and where N95s are part of the PPE required for airborne and or specific precautions.

<b>Administrative areas <u>within</u> a care facility</b>	Examples: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Admin offices (i.e. CNE or leader)</li> <li>• Education or meeting rooms on a unit</li> <li>• Administrative wings (clinical and non-clinical)</li> <li>• Libraries</li> <li>• Supportive services</li> <li>• FMO/support areas</li> <li>• Regional laundry plants</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Medical-grade mask</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• All staff, medical staff and contracted service providers</li> </ul>

<b>Administrative areas <u>not</u> located in a care facility</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Corporate services where care is not provided</li> <li>Examples: Begbie Hall, Aulds Road, etc.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Non-medical, 3-layer cloth masks can be worn when 2-metres distance cannot be maintained</li> <li>Medical-grade masks must be worn when visiting or transitioning through a care facility</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>All staff, medical staff and contracted service providers</li> </ul>
<b>Common areas</b>	<p>Areas where staff, medical staff, patients, clients, residents, families and/or members of the public are present, e.g.:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>hospital atrium</li> <li>hallways</li> <li>coffee shops</li> <li>elevators</li> <li>washrooms</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Medical-grade masks</li> <li>Medical-grade mask can be removed for eating or drinking, while maintaining 2-metres distance</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>All staff, medical staff and contracted service providers</li> </ul>

<b>Health-care facility or care environment</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>When entering and moving around <b>any</b> health care facility, including clinical and non-clinical areas</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Medical-grade masks</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>All visitors</li> </ul>
<b>LTC / AL facility</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>All areas</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Medical-grade masks</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>All visitors</li> </ul>

Environment	Environment Example	Type of Mask	Used by
<b>Healthcare facility or care environment</b> <b>EXCLUDED</b> – Long-Term Care and Assisted Living settings	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• During transport within a healthcare facility</li> <li>• When moving around a healthcare facility</li> <li>• While in a waiting area (ED or any department)</li> <li>• While in any bed space that is only separated by a curtain in the ED</li> <li>• Actively coughing in a multi-bed room on droplet or contact/droplet precautions                         <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ single room should be prioritised where possible, see <a href="#">bed placement for patients on additional precautions</a></li> </ul> </li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Medical-grade mask</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Patients</li> </ul>
