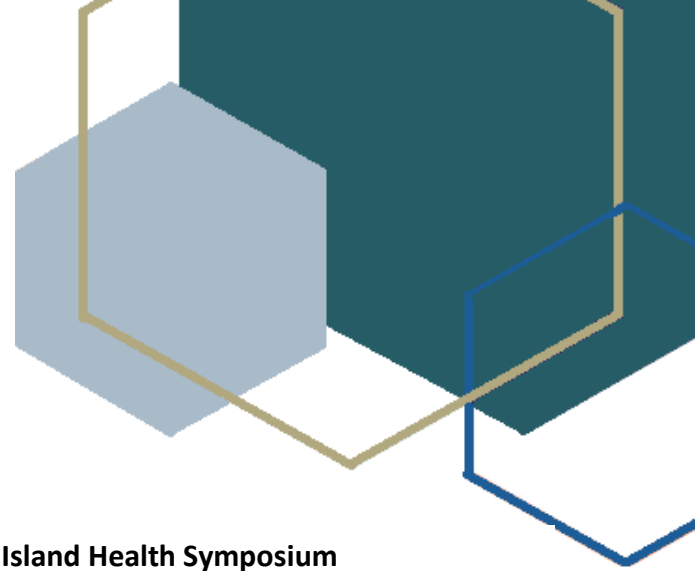

Due to a North American-wide shortage of citrate coagulation collection tubes, Island Health is reducing use when safe to do so. Island Health is committed to safe patient care and reduction of coagulation testing will be undertaken cautiously following best practices.

Expert Panel moves forward on current state analysis of Electronic Fetal Monitoring at Island Health

Island Health is exploring the Choosing Wisely Canada recommendation [“Don’t do electronic fetal monitoring \(EFM\) for low risk women in labour; use intermittent auscultation”](#) as one of the three recommendations required to achieve Level 2 Designation.

Our panel of experts is working with Clinical Analytics to conduct a current state analysis of EFM usage at Island Health and is applying the Society of Obstetricians and Gynaecologists of Canada (SOGC) recommendations for when EFM is recommended or should be considered to ensure healthy delivery.
