

Recommended Lab Investigations

In order **to rule out medical problems** that may be causing or contributing to the delirium, the following screening blood work should be done. Tests need to have been done within 3 months; more recent results are preferable.

<u>CBC</u>	 anemia blood dyscrasia infection
<u>B₁₂</u>	 pernicious anemia malabsorption malnutrition
Folate	- Malnutrition
<u>TSH</u>	 hypo/hyperthyroidism
<u>FBG</u>	- diabetes
Bun/Creatinine	renal failuredehydration
Electrolytes	 dehydration SIADH (syndrome of inappropriate anti-diuretic hormone or hypernatremia)
Drug levels	 Digoxin anticonvulsant Lithium Nortriptyline
Ca/PO ₄ (calcium, phosphates)	 hypo/hyperparathyroidism boney metastases

Do these tests to rule out causes of delirium

ESR	- temporal arteritis
Cortisol Level	- Cushing's
LFT (Liver Function Tests)	- alcohol abuse
Chest X Ray	- carcinoma, pneumonia
EKG	- atrial fibrillation
O2 sat	- COPD OPD
CT Scan	 subdural haematoma, meningiomas normal pressure hydrocephalus
Urinalysis	– UTI
VDRL	– neurosyphilis
