What to expect while in the hospital, or when escorting/visiting family.

- If you are willing—please identify yourself as "Aboriginal or First Nations" for hospital staff to notify the Aboriginal Liaison Nurse.
- Bring your BC Care Card & Status Card.
- Check with your Band and/or patient travel clerk prior to hospitalization for medical coverage, travel assistance, meals, and accommodation guidelines.
- Bring list of current prescription and non-prescription medications.
- One cot will be provided to a parent or guardian to stay in their child's room (limited to children's unit).
