

o support culturally appropriate care for Aboriginal patients, Island Health is pleased to connect you with an Aboriginal Liaison Nurse upon request.

Patients, family and friends can request a referral to the Aboriginal Liaison Nurse before or during a hospital stay.

Aboriginal Liaison Nurses can help by:

- Providing emotional support and advocacy
- ♦ Explaining health care information
- Working with hospital staff, patients, family and health professionals in community to support clear communication and discharge planning
- Supporting holistic care including physical, emotional and spiritual
- Identifying eligibility and access to First Nation Health Benefits
- Assist in patient care planning with hospital staff and health professionals in community
- Referring patients and families to spiritual care upon request

Aboriginal Liaison Nurses work together with Status and Non-Status Aboriginal, Inuit and Métis communities to maintain and improve the health of Aboriginal people.



Things to know:

- Please bring your Personal Health Number (formerly BC Care Card) and Status Card.
- Check with your Band and/or Patient Travel Clerk as soon as possible to see if you are eligible for medical coverage,
- Please let us know how we can make your hospital stay more comfortable.
